Presidential Fellowships for Teachers

The Presidential Fellowships for Teachers program will award 50 fellowships to qualified teachers who are admitted to tigble graduate programs at UCA. Fellowships are valued at 50 percent of graduate tuition and fees, and are renewable for the duration of the degree program as long as the recipient continues to meet program requirement. These ellowships carry a value ranging from S200 to over \$4200 depending upon the degree program. Recipients of Presidential Fellowships for Teachers are also eligible for the Fail 2005 Presidential lacentive for Faculate southy fue Teachers.
